We will be continuing the <u>Public Screening</u> format at the Arsenal Cinema with a film from Ingo Kratisch. On January 11, 2018, at 7:00 pm we will be showing LOGIK DES GEFÜHLS (FRG 1981), in which Harun Farocki plays "the Deranged One." In the presence of Ingo Kratisch and Jutta Sartory.

Shirin Barghnavard, who was the scholarship holder of our **residency** over the last 3 months, will be back in Germany this year within the framework of the residency Akademie Schloss Solitude.

The exhibition **Mit anderen Mitteln – By Other Means** can be seen at the Neuen Berliner Kunstverein (n.b.k.) within the framework of the <u>Harun Farocki Retrospektive</u> until January 28. It shows a selection of filmic installations, a number of which have been realized in cooperation with Antje Ehmann.

In December 2017 the book **Von Godard Sprechen (Speaking About Godard)** from Kaja Silverman and Harun Farocki was republished as the second volume of Harun Farocki's **Schriften (Writings)**. **Reviews** of the first volume can be found below.

In conclusion to the Farocki Now Academy in October 2017, Marianna Maruyama has produced an issue of the digital journal Rosa Mercedes. Her audio montage is now available online.

In addition, we would like to draw your attention to further <u>new publications</u> and <u>international</u> <u>exhibitions</u> with works from Harun Farocki.

LOGIK DES GEFÜHLS

Ingo Kratisch FRG 1981 Screenplay: Jutta Sartory 35 mm OV German 98 min

At the 12th International Forum of New Cinema in 1982, Ingo Kratisch was represented by two films - as a cameraman on Harun Farocki's "Etwas wird sichtbar" (Before Your Eyes - Vietnam) and as director and editor of **LOGIK DES GEFÜHLS** (Logic of Emotion). In a poetic text, Cäzilia Gall writes: "The main protagonist is Georg, lovesick, for whom there is nothing more to portray. People, whom he meets. They are like extras on the empty planks of his heart: 'The Traveller,' 'The Poet,' 'The Lover,' 'The Gambler,' 'The Deranged One,' 'The Man in the Port,' and others." And the plot: "What happens? Nothing much. [...] Where is it set? In an in-between space, between lost love and a coming love. Winter. Berlin. 1981. Anna has separated from Georg. Silence."

Starring Farocki as "The Deranged One."

Ingo Kratisch and Jutta Sartory will be present as Arsenal's guests.

2. Retrospective: Harun Farocki. Schriften 1 & 2 *

"Speaking about Godard" presents conversations between Harun Farocki and Kaja Silverman about eight films by Godard – "Vivre sa vie" (1962); "Le Mépris" (1963); "Alphaville, une étrange aventure de Lemmy Caution" (1965); "Week-end" (1967); "Le Gai savoir" (1968); "Numéro deux" (1975); "Passion" (1981) and "Nouvelle vague" (1990). Farocki and Silverman held their debates in the mid-1990s in English, between Berlin and Berkeley, and published their book in 1998 both in the original and in German, translated by Roger M. Buergel. Eight chapters, corresponding to the number of films discussed, provide an insight into Farocki's and Silverman's view of Godard's work, individual scenes are retold meticulously and analyzed structurally, visual and linguistic research converge. The German re-publication includes the preface of the 1998 German edition by Hanns Zischler as well as a postscript by the publisher Doreen Mende.

Harun Farocki. Schriften 1 & 2 are now available via the Buchhandlung Walther König.

Reviews of Schriften 1: Farocki's fragmentary autobiography "Zehn, Zwanzig, Dreißig, Vierzig" has already been reviewed by Fritz Göttler in the <u>Süddeutschen Zeitung</u> and Andreas Richartz on the <u>Artblog Cologne</u>.
