Dear friends,

On **Friday September 7, 2018, at 7:30 p.m.** we will present the film **TRANSIT LEVANTKADE** (1991, NL) by **Rosemarie Blank** on the occasion of the **Public Screening** at the Arsenal Cinema.

In 1991, TRANSIT LEVANTKADE screened at the Duisburg Film Week and as part of ZDF's "Das kleine Fernsehspiel." Rosemarie Blank's film combines enacted scenes and historical material and is about the past and present of Levantkade in Amsterdam's old harbor, from where people left to go to South America in the early 20th century as well as from where – not much later – the deportation of forced laborers was organized under the Nazi occupation. The "transit" of the title could connect Blank's film with Anna Seghers' 1941 novel, one of Harun Farocki's favorites, as well as to Christian Petzold's 2018 adaptation TRANSIT (2018) and also to FLUCHTWEG NACH MARSEILLE (1977) by Ingemo Engström und Gerhard Theuring. Showing the port as a zone of contact, a relay station of migration, a transient place, with alternative, nomadic ways of living, proves to be a productive task of film and/or of political historiography.

From the beginning of September we will be welcoming **Ali Al Adawy** as the third fellowship holder of the **Harun Farocki Residency** in Berlin.

Ali Al Adawy is an Alexandria-based film curator, editor, and critic of moving images, urban artistic practices, and cultural history. Earlier this year he conceived a film program on Harun Farocki's works in Alexandria and in Cairo with the support of the local Goethe-Institut. On this occasion he also edited a publication with a selection of Farockis texts translated in

arabic. In February 2018 he made a contribution to the Berlinale symposium [Think Film No 6: Archival Constellations](#).

The residency which is financially supported by the Goethe-Institut, will provide Ali Al Adawy the opportunity to further his interest in the work and thought of Harun Farocki.

During his three months stay in Berlin we will introduce Ali Al Adawy and some of his research to the Berlin audience at silent green Kulturquartier. An announcement containing the details for this evening event will be sent separately.
