Dear friends.

The second chapter of the multiple part journal **Rosa Mercedes 03: Skip Norman** is now online. "**Testimonies**" gives voice to friends and colleagues who knew the Afro-American filmmaker and cinematographer Skip Norman (1933 - 2015) between 1966 and 1978 and beyond. The recollections of his former dffb fellow students Johannes Beringer, Carlos Bustamante, Gerd Conradt, Georg Lehner and Helke Sander, as well as an audio conversation between the filmmakers Shirikiana Aina and Haile Gerima sketch a fragmentary portrait of Skip Norman against the background of his cinematic activities in Germany and the USA.

In addition, two films by Johannes Beringer, in which Skip Norman participated, are shown, as well as a series of previously unpublished photographs that Skip Norman took in 1982 in Columbus, Ohio, where Klaus Wyborny also met him fleetingly. In the "Documents" section we present the cover and editorial of *Frauen und Film 5* (1975), dedicated to the "aktion 218" in Berlin, in which Skip Norman and Helke Sander were involved. The second chapter of *Rosa Mercedes 03* is edited by Madeleine Bernstorff and Volker Pantenburg.

In the **Showcase** section of our website, we publish a "block diagram" in Farocki's handwriting, which was part of an extensive concept entitled "Research Program Audiovisual Learning Tool on a Topic of Political Economy," (Forschungsprogramm audiovisuelles Lernmittel zu einem Thema der politischen Ökonomie) and is dated January 1970.
