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## Harun Farocki Institut Newsletter September 2022

Dear friends,

On **September 23**, the exhibition **Harun Farocki against War** will open at Forum Stadtpark during the **Steirischen Herbst** (Sept. 22 – Oct. 16, 2022) in Graz. Conceived by curator, author, and artist **Antje Ehmann** in collaboration with the Harun Farocki Institut, the exhibition presents a cross-section of Harun Farocki's works against war. These bear witness to Farocki's lifelong interest in countering media images of war with a new cinematic language. At 7 p.m., **Clio Nicastro** will give the opening address. The following day at 8 p.m., **Clio Nicastro and Tom Holert** will participate in a panel discussion, **The Special Optics of War** with Oleksiy Kuchansky, moderated by David Riff.

Four new articles have appeared in our online journal Rosa Mercedes 04: Turning Points: Coincidences in Prepositions, including the presentation of two video works by artist and co-founder of Forum Lenteng Otty Widasari—annotated by a short conversation about her practice, contributions by writer Haytham el-Wardany (here), theorist Clio Nicastro (here), and the Wuhan diaries authored by a group of friends (aka Z and his friends) who lived together in Wuhan during the lockdown in 2020. This brings the editorial project as such to an end, which does not preclude a future continuation in a different form.

The ad hoc residency with Ukrainian filmmaker and artist **Marichka Lukianchuk**, initiated in April in collaboration with Artists at Risk, has now been selected for the Berlin Senate's **Ad Hoc Fellowship Program**. This sixth edition of the **Harun Farocki Residency** will take place from September 2022 to February 2023.

This month, the website section **Showcase** displays digitized material from the Farocki estate: a science film by **Paul François Fornallaz**, Zurich (1951) about the acceleration and efficiency increase of work processes, which Farocki used in several of his films.
